Stewardship Update

As with most churches, First Presbyterian Church operates on the generous gifts of its members and friends. You believe in what we stand for and support the work we do. Thank you.

Each year you are asked to prayerfully consider what God would have you give to our church's ministry and mission. We want to keep you apprised of the anonymous pledges we have received to date. As of January 2 we have received

45 Pledges for \$152,990.00.

To each family that has returned their pledge cards we say, "Thank You." If you have yet to return your card, please consider doing so. Your anticipated giving helps your leaders better anticipate the operating of the church in the new year.

Per Capita

Within the Presbyterian structure we attempt to separate some administrative costs (especially travel cost and meals for our elected representatives) from those of doing mission. One way we do that is by charging an administrative fee for each member of a local church called "Per Capita." The cost is divided out to cover the work of the General Assembly, Synod, and Presbytery, the three regions of the church beyond our local body. This year that fee will be approximately \$45. It helps our annual budget process if you are able and can give a special gift to the church for that amount. Thank you for your prayerful consideration.

Howdy Everyone.....

...and thank you for all the wonderful Christmas greetings you sent Terri and my way this year. What a joy to celebration with you the birth of our Lord through worship, songs, children's programs, Christmas caroling, special visits to our shut-ins, ... These are great ways to Pass on the Faith to our children, our family, friends, and neighbors.

And now, WELCOME TO 2018!! Hard to believe but here we are and what a great year it is going to be. And why will it be great?

Not necessarily because of a new tax code, even though we hope right decisions are being made to help our community and nation continue its economic prosperity;

Not because there is peace on earth for there are still too many power-hungry leaders pursuing their goals at all costs;

Not because all diseases will be cured in the near future even though we pray for God's healing touch and the end of suffering;

Not because everything will be hunky dory on the home front because issues always seem to arise within church and amongst family and friends;

No, it will be a great year because we have an opportunity to live this year in relationship with a living God who loves us, understands us, and will direct us through the work of Holy Spirit as we follow Jesus our Lord!!

As we enter 2018, we are preparing to discern what God has next for FPC. There will be three steps along the preparatory way this coming year.

1. New Elders. We will elect 8+ new Ruling Elders to guide the ongoing ministry and mission of our church. Even though we do this every year, this year we have a larger number to elect. We are very grateful for those who have served and anticipate the energy and direction God will initiate through this new team and the ongoing Elders who continue to serve.
2. Mission Study Team. Part of the Pastoral Search process is to do a mission study. A team of seven has committed to serving in this capacity on behalf of the church. The work they do and the conclusions they reach will shape the leadership FPC seeks for its future mission and direction. Keep these folks (who will be elected at the January 28th Congregational Meeting) in your prayers.
3. Pastor Nominating Committee. Following the completion of the Mission Study the congregation will elect a PNC. This critical team will publish our Church Information Form, receive resumes (called Pastoral Information Forms – PIFs), filter through and select a handful of candidates to pursue, and select and present a candidate to the congregation.

What a full year this will be. Prayer is the foundation for discerning God's direction and receiving a successful outcome. Please keep the process and those involved central in your prayers.

One final note. Beginning January 7, we will offer Sunday School classes for **children and adults**. We will focus on the Book of Acts and how God transformed the world through the early Christians. Adults will meet in the Fellowship Hall and children in various classrooms. CJ and I are structuring discussion questions so that those who participate with their children and/or grandchildren can discuss during the week what we are learning. Should be a great family building time. If you plan to attend, please let the church office know so we can prepare materials for you.

Looking forward to a GREAT 2018 with you.





As I sit here and write my article, all is quiet in the church, A few hours earlier at our youth lock in, it was full of jokes, laughter, maybe scream or two as someone pops out from around a corner and yells boo. I always go into these thinking why am I doing this and what have I gotten myself into, but when I come out on the other side I am like oh yah for the kids and the relationship that they have with each other, myself and the memories. I pray they will look back and remember fondly the church and the love that they felt.

Christian Education took the feed back and the suggestions from the church wide study and would like to introduce a 9 am Sunday school study. Our first study will focus on the book of Acts starting January 7th. Everyone is welcome to join. We understand that choir starts at 9:30, but please do not let that discourage anyone from attending. We can fill you in on what you missed. I am also excited to offer a children/youth study also on the book of Acts. It will run in conjunction with the adult study. Our goal is to give families the opportunities and resources to discuss what was learned in Sunday school. Their will be discussion points to carry over to your dinner table. If you have a child interested in participating in the youth study, please let CJ or Paul know. We would like to ensure enough materials for everyone.

The next fun and exciting event on my agenda is the annual youth ski retreat in Casper. This overnight experience, for 5th graders and up, will start off Friday, January 12 with games, scripture and fellowship with other Presbyterian youth from across the state. We will finish of the over night with a full day of skiing or snowboarding at Hogadon Mountain. For \$50, your child will have the opportunity to ski or snowboard with full equipment rental, learnings geared towards their ability level, and lift ticket. The Presbytery of Wyoming will cover breakfast and lunch on Saturday. If you have a non-skier, like me, they are more then welcome to still join us and hang out in the new lodge with me and spend the day socializing and/or reading. That cost is \$20. Money and registration, rental agreement, and all the other necessary paperwork is also do to me by the 7th. Friends are encouraged to tag along.

If that isn't enough excitement for the month of January, Sunday the 21st, is the youths 3rd annual Chili Cook-off. In addition to the committees, individual members are welcome to throw their ladle into the chili pot. Money raised from the Cook-Off will go towards the youth mission opportunities this summer. There are several in the works. The ROCCS (Recreation, Outdoor, Camping, Conference and Service), a committee of the Presbytery of Wyoming along with Jackson Hole are looking at a mission trip this summer to serve in an area that was damaged in the hurricanes of last fall. If leaving the state is not your youths thing, we will also have the chance to serve again this year with the mobile Vacation Bible School.

During the Chili Cook-off this year, the Christian Education committee will be hosting a silent auction to help raise money for First Presbyterian Church's portion of camp tuition. The past 2 years our church has sent an average of 10 youth from this church to camp. Did you know that the Presbytery of Wyoming challenges each congregation to pay 1/3 of the camping cost to send a child from their church to camp? The silent auction will help with our portion. If you are blessed with a talent that you would like to offer as an item for the silent auction, or you are gifted with the art of organizing a silent auction please contact CJ or a member of the Christian Education committee. In the past items such as, bird houses, services, baked goods, hand crafted items have been donated to help raise money.

As I hear the youth starting to stir, I will wrap up my article. I would like to send you off with a blessing for the New Year. "In this New Year, may you come to know our Lord as a close friend, comforter, Savior and this year be filled with as many blessings as there are stars I the sky."

An Almost Year-end Note from Your Budget and Finance Committee

Your Budget and Finance Committee wants to thank you for your generosity to the ministry of First Presbyterian. Transitional years can be difficult on church giving, especially when a long-term pastor and family departs. This year we have also had several unanticipated expenses with our mechanical systems. Yet, in the midst of these things you have remained faithful. Several members have gone over and above with special gifts. One member blessed us with a surprise gift of gold coins one Sunday in the offering at year-end 2016. Wow! When we sell the coins and with the special gifts given, we anticipate ending 2017 close to break-even. Hallelujah and thank you!

As your financial team we not only manage the income and outflow of our finances, we also work to anticipate what may be coming. There are two areas of special concern as we move into the future.

First is the reality that we have an aging building. Last year's repairs of the sump pump, air conditioning system, and boiler are symptomatic of potential future needs. We want to continue building reserves (Rainy Day Funds) so when (not if) repairs need to be made we will have some resources with which to do so.

Second we know additional expenses are coming in our search for a new pastor. Our treasurer, Dennis Heizer, anticipates an additional \$20,000 for the search, find, and move process. This expense will come from our reserves as well.

As you prayerfully consider what the Lord would have you give to this ministry during this next year, please keep these three things in mind: Our annual budget, the Rainy Day Reserves, and the pastor search process. All of our tithes and offerings serve the Kingdom of God. All giving beyond annual expenses will go into our reserves for the future. Thank you once again for your support of the ministry of FPC.






