#### Helloooooo, First Presbyterians!

What a wonderful day we experienced yesterday (1/28) with the visit of the Bar J Wranglers to our time of worship, our potluck dinner, and the Congregational meeting. The Spirit of the Lord was present as we worshipped God and received the reports of the Session and conducted the business of the church. One of the central principles of our Reformed Faith is that the Spirit directs the church through the voice of the people. We saw that happen yesterday!

*The Session.* What a wonderful group of folks have been called by God through the voice of the people to lead and serve this church. As I listened to their reports (if you were unable to attend you can get a packet of all the reports in the church office) I was reminded of the incredible commitment they have made to FPC and the tremendous amount of work they have accomplished. They <u>deserve our thanks</u>, especially those who have served their term and are now taking a well-deserved break.

I also want to give a special shout out to the Fellowship Committee which I forgot to do at the meeting. They have organized many opportunities for the people of the church to gather so we might get to know one another better. Yesterday, they set up the tables, organized the potluck, cleaned the dishes, and did it quietly and gracefully. How representative they are to the character of this congregation. Thank you.

# Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he. (King James Version)

The New International Version translates the Hebrew in this fashion:

# Where there is no revelation, the people cast off restraint; but blessed is he who keeps the *law.*

I like the distinction between the two. Lots of people and businesses create a vision statement that gives direction. If we don't have something to harness that direction (vision), something that restrains us from getting off our true course, fulfilling our true purpose, it is easy to find ourselves and/or our business perishing in one way or another.

Vision is important for us in the church as well. However, different from many other areas of life, our vision comes not just from self-analysis and insightful planning but from divine revelation. It is as Proverb says, if we don't have God's direction for why we exist and what we are called to do, we risk perishing as this part of God's family. As I mentioned above, Presbyterians believe God 'reveals his will' as God's people prayerfully talk about what God has laid on their hearts. For the mission study process to be successful we <u>need your participation</u>. Therefore:

We all need to be in prayer for those who will be leading the mission study process.

We all need to be in prayer asking God to reveal to us what is next.

We all need to be involved (*youth, young adults, families,* please take note that this "ALL" includes you!) in sharing our hopes and dreams, the vision God has laid on our hearts, so we can discern God's direction and define how God would move us into his future.

The year ahead is going to be exciting as we look to see all God has instore for this part of his family. Thanks be to God!

#### **Online Directory:**

Go to Instant Church Directory and log on the Membership box at the top. If you don't know the password, call or email the church office. Once you are in, download the directory to your desktop. You will need to update that download every couple of months as we make changes.

You can download the app for instant church directory onto your mobile devise. Directions for this are below. You need to have your email on your profile in the directory in order for this to work. If you do not have it on there, email the church office and we can get it on there for you. This action updates when we do.

The online church directory is now live and located on the church website www.sheridanfpc.church

- The directory can be accessed by clicking on the link **Online Church Photo Directory.** Depending on the browser you use, you may be prompted to click on Open or Download next. Click Open. Next, you will be prompted to insert the password which is **call or email the office to get password.** Be sure to include the question mark in the password. The directory is viewed in a pdf. format. If you want to make the pages larger, you can do so by clicking at the top of each page where indicated to resize.
- If you have provided an e-mail, you can access by mobile device by downloading the **Instant Church Directory** app. It is available for Apple devices at the App Store on your device. It is available for Android devices on <u>www.amazon.com</u> by searching for **Instant Church Directory app.**

Once you have downloaded the app, follow directions for its usage. You will need to input your e-mail, and then send for a password which will be sent to you by e-mail. If it does not work, simply send for a new password and try again.






