Greetings Everyone.

A modern-day worship song contains these wonderful lyrics:

O God, You are my God, and I will ever praise You (repeat). I will seek You in the morning, and I will learn to walk in your ways; And step by step You'll lead me, and I will follow You all of my days.

This brief chorus outlines much of the Christian walk. It begins with acknowledging that God is God and I am not! Just like the beginning of the Lord's prayer it emphasizes that one of our goals in life is to praise him. Then, after focusing our souls on God, it outlines our responsibilities. I will seek You...I will learn to walk... not all at once, but step by step...and I will follow...through the whole of life.

What a beautiful and simple image.

As a congregation we are following a similar process. Weekly we refocus and recommit ourselves to the sovereignty of God during our time of worship. Then, as we leave the sanctuary we continue through the week to seek, to learn, to follow step by step the God who loves us and leads us.

Part of our seeking as a congregation is to discern God's will about the future. Your Mission Study Team is initiating that process under the leadership of Rev. Steve Shive, General Presbyter, and with my support as best as I am able. They are doing a great job as they interview key organizations in the community to hear their observations about Sheridan's strengths as well as the needs they see.

A next step in this "step by step" process we are pursuing as we seek God's direction will begin on <u>MARCH</u> <u>18</u>. Rev. Shive will be preaching on that Sunday. Following the worship service we will have an All-Church Potluck followed by a time to help FPC look inward at our strengths. Here are somethings we need to consider for this important time:

- † <u>It is a potluck!</u> I loved our Congregational Meeting potluck!! If possible, please replicate!!! Yum.
- † It will last up to <u>3 hours</u>. Yeowy!! We want it to be done right.
- † The process we will be using is called **Appreciative Inquiry**. It is very helpful and very good. It works best when the different age groups of the congregation are represented and participating.
- † For **families**, it is at the end of Winter break for schools. If possible, please organize your schedules so you can be back in town and participate.
- † If, for whatever reason, you cannot participate, there will be <u>make up sessions</u>. Please, please, please plan on attending a session. Every voice needs to be heard so we can gain a true picture of First Presbyterian.

Remember, this is part of the Mission Study process. The goal of the Mission Study is to:

- † Help determine the mission God has designed for FPC as we move into his future work in us and through us in Sheridan, Wyoming:
- † Focus this mission on behalf of the FPC congregation. The results will be presented to the whole congregation for its discussion and approval:
- † Provide the foundation to be used in the seeking of the next pastor who will help lead FPC in fulfilling that mission.

Dear Lord: We continue to be in prayer as we follow You step by step. We know this is your church and that You are not done with us yet. We are excited to discern the direction You have instore for us. We ask that You give us ears to hear You and the courage to follow the direction you give. We lift up the Mission Study Team and ask that You give them wisdom and insight. Fill them with your Holy Spirit for the work they do. We pray this in the name of Jesus our Savior and Lord. Amen.
