Greetings Everyone.

This coming Sunday, October 7, is INVITE SOMEONE TO CHURCH Sunday. I know that is exciting to so many of you. Already a good number have told me they know exactly who they want to invite. That is great. I also know inviting someone to church can be terrifying. What if they reject my offer? What if it turns them off to church forever? What if they talk about me behind my back? So many reasons to be silent.

That having been said, excited or terrified, let me share with you research data from two different sources about the power of personal invitation. First, *The Institute for American Church Growth* asked over 10,000 church-goers this question: What was responsible for your coming to Christ and this church? The results?

- 2% I had a special need
- 3% I just walked in
- 6% I liked the minister
- 1% I visited here
- 5% I liked the Sunday school
- 1/2% I attended a gospel meeting
- 3% I liked the programs

79% A friend or relative invited me

Christianity Today, one of America's leading Christian periodicals, has a division called Church Trainer. They present to local churches the following statistics as they talk about, "The Power of an Invite."

"Every week I ask you, 'What initially brought you to church?' Here are the statistics:"

- 6-8% Walked in by own initiative
- 2-3% Liked a program offered
- 8-10% Liked the pastor
- 3-4% Had a need met by the church.
- 1-2% Were Evangelized
- 3-4% Attracted by Sunday School

70-85% Invited by a relative or friend!

Although the statistics slightly differ from one another, I believe you still get the point. Invitation is the most powerful tool in our tool belt of seeing someone come to church. Such is the research data.

This having been said, as Christians our commitment is not to the following of data. For political candidates, maybe. Not for us. Even though data provides important information, our primary goal as we say in our Mission Statement is to "Follow Jesus Christ." So, what did Jesus do?

Jesus, at the very beginning of his ministry, invited those who were to become his disciples to "come and see." Note this passage from John 1:35-39

³⁵ The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, ³⁶ and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" ³⁷ The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. ³⁸ When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" ³⁹ He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon.

Jesus invited people. It was as if he was saying, "Come check it out." "Follow Jesus Christ." One final thought. As we take the step to invite people, we also need to be thinking about how we will greet them when they come. How will we engage them? How will say, "Hi," to them? How can we say with our eyes or our hands shakes, "God loves you and so do I?" How will we share the incredible love and warmth that exists within First Presbyterian Church?

DEACON'S FUND

Did you know that First Presbyterian has a Deacon's Fund? Yes it does!

The Deacon's Fund is designed to help those in need within our church as well as in the community. Primarily the fund is used to buy a small amount of food for those in need (\$25 at Albertson's) or gasoline for a vehicle (driver's license and insurance card required at the suggestion of Sheridan police). Additionally, within our congregation we have helped cover heating costs during winter and other incidental costs that have arisen in the course of life including some pharmaceutical bills.

So, how much money does this amount to? Our budget is \$1800.00. We do not help with such costs as insurance or rent which could take a major portion of the whole annual amount. We also help people find the Volunteers of America which has the resource to help with overnight lodging and some other major items. It should also be noted that the churches work together so some of those who appear in need do not take advantage of compassionate folks who desire to help.

STEWARDSHIP

Most often when we talk about Stewardship we are talking about money and, at this time of year, everyone is gearing up for the year-end-giving season. We are no different. Here are some things we need to be thinking about as a congregation:

1. Giving to the church is first and foremost giving to the Lord. It is returning a portion of our resources with which God has blessed us so God's work through us can bless others. (Deuteronomy 8:11-18; Malachi 3:8-10).
2. Giving to the work of the Lord should be joy-filled (2 Corinthians 9:6,7). Giving to the work of the Lord through FPC is ONE WAY to say, "Thank You, Lord, for your wonderful blessing to us. Use this pledge to bless another!"



Let me close with this story from an article I read in a periodical called, Church fuel. It was about the power and importance of inviting and welcoming.

I had a conversation recently with someone that had been attending our church for about a month. I asked them, as I often do others, how they began attending our church. Their response had a profound impact on me. They told me that a friend of theirs who had been attending for some time had consistently invited them, but this person said they found excuse after excuse not to come.

After a particularly hard season in their life, they finally decided it was time to come to check out this church their friend had told them had changed their life. She wanted to see if it could have that same impact on her.

One month later, she told me that it was all true. She just "came to see" and has not left. In fact, she told me that the church was helping her heal a great wound in life. I love those stories.

The key to this story was how her friend consistently invited her to come to church with her. In God's providence, He used her friend and the simple, but powerful habit of inviting.

May God bless us and touch lives as we take the step to invite someone to church.




