Dear Ones,

Years ago, I had the opportunity to visit the Isle of Iona off the western coast of Scotland. The Christian tradition dates back nearly 1500 years on this tiny island and many persons make pilgrimage here to share in time at the Iona Abbey. Rev. George MacLeod, who helped with the restoration of the abbey and the formation of the Iona Community in the 1930s, referred to the island as a "thin place", a place where there is but tissue between the material and the spiritual.

In many ways, this is no surprise, because the Christian tradition on Iona has long been guided by and influenced by the Celtic Christian tradition in which there is no distinction between religion and daily life. Celtic Christians perceive the divine in every person, in each animal, in every plant, and in every event of the day before them. As such, faith permeates every aspect of existence and every place is a thin place.

We can take a wonderful lesson from such a place and tradition. Our faith is meant to be out in the open not only shaping our interactions with one another and with creation but sanctifying every aspect of existence. One author describes how the prayers of the Celtic tradition do this in saying they are prayers "for everyone who wants to live their faith every minute of every day of every week of every year." In this time, I offer you one of those traditional Celtic prayers that you might live your faith in the very moment and time before you:

My body is as tense as a cat's

As it stalks its pray.

Lord, relax my body.

My thoughts swirl like willow branches

Caught in autumn winds.

Lord, still my thoughts.

My soul is as heavy as peat Freshly dug from the bog. Lord, lighten my soul.

My heart is as dark as soil Sodden with the winter rains. Lord, brighten my heart.

The biggest and most obvious change will be Logos will take place in your home. Don't worry! You won't be left to figure everything out on your own. Once a week, starting the first week in October, you will get an email that will give you an outline and directions for the coming week's Logos. The email will contain the nightly theme, suggested menu, recipes, grace idea, table topic/discussion questions, Scripture, mini lesson on the Scripture, spiritual practice/worship skill to do, and a game/activity/craft. There will not be any Zoom/YouTube for you to worry about attending as all will be done around the table during dinner. Pictures sent back to me would be fabulous! If you are interested, please let the church office know and we will add you to the email list.

Youth group will be starting up again on Wednesday, September 16 from 7-8 pm in the youth room. We will be following the rules that Session has set with worship. To attend youth group, masks will be required and social distancing practices will be in place.




