We will finish October with over 300 cards sent. Way to go!



FROM PASTOR KARL—

Dear Ones,

This year the end of November brings with it the Advent season. Advent is a time of anticipation when we prepare ourselves for the arrival of the Messiah at Christmas. But, in many ways, Advent is symbolic of our lives. Christ has come and yet we are always preparing for the arrival of our Messiah. Christ's arrival in our lives is not just as a one-time event but occurs each day and in each moment. God is incarnate again and again in each day in the love we experience, the peace we are given, and the encouragement we know. Thus, Advent is a terrific season for us to learn new ways of preparing to meet Jesus Christ in our lives each and every day.

In our preparation this year, I want to encourage you to join me in a daily Advent devotional that has been published by A Sanctified Art. The devotional is meant to be done each day in your home, on your own time and is interactive with prayers, coloring, and prompts for reflection that are all based on the lectionary passages for the season. In this way, it will coincide with worship through the season. The devotional will offer us many ways to prepare ourselves not only to meet Christ at Christmas but in each and every day. Copies of the devotional will be available in the office beginning November 18. The first day of Advent (and of the devotional) is November 29. Again, I hope you will join me in letting this devotional guide us through the season as we seek to prepare the way of the Lord not only into the world but into our very own hearts each and every day.

What you write on your link is up to you. It only has to be positive and uplifting. We all know that some days are better than others, so if you have an extra special day, add two or three.

The psalmist said that my cup is so full it spills over. Let's fill our favorite cup and spill it!



Our "One eye on the Past" featured woman this month is Gloria Stresky.

Gloria Joyce (Wittwer) Stresky was born May 5, 1924, to Swiss parents, Gottlieb and Minnae (Minnie), in Monticello, Wisconsin. After graduating from Albany High School in 1942, she attended the Groves-Barnhart Secretarial School in Madison, from which she was assigned a coveted position as assistant to the director of the War Production Board in Washington D.C. until the end of World War II.

A fun tidbit: During this pre-computerized age when most documents were written or coded manually, files for the The Manhattan Project [aka: the atom bomb] were passed from person-to-person, then tucked inside a large vault, the combination to which was written in the back of Gloria's stenotype book. One can only imagine the implications if the code had fallen into the wrong hands!

After the end of the war, Gloria transferred to the State Department where she worked until the birth of her daughter, Patricia, in 1947.

Prior to moving to D.C. from Wisconsin, she met James Werner Stresky (who was stationed at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station near Chicago) at a Methodist dance for soldiers.

After corresponding while he served as Radioman First Class aboard the USS Shea in the Pacific Theater, they married on January 31, 1946, and lived in D.C. until the fall of 1951 when fate changed the course of their lives.

Hearing about a rare opportunity for a court reporter in Wyoming, Jim flew to Sheridan, interviewed with the judges (who'd never seen a stenotype before), then immediately flew back to D.C. to tell Gloria he'd been hired on the spot.

Pregnant with Mary Jo, who'd be born the following March, she asked, "Where's Wyoming?" while frantically packing for their new adventures. Shortly upon arriving in Sheridan, Jim and Gloria joined the First Presbyterian Church. Their son, Steve, would be born in 1956.

In addition to serving on the Session, the financial committee, Circle I, and as an elder, Gloria taught Sunday school at the old gothic church on South Main, then at the new church on Colonial Drive.

Decades of her family singing in the choir, Jim's "famous" bird whistle and booming bass voice as he narrated holiday stories, the children wearing angel wings in Christmas pageants, listening to the magnificent pipe organ melodies resonating throughout the church, and serving post-service coffee and cookies with her fellow Presbyterian Women, are just a few of the warm memories she carries in her heart.

Before her health prevented her from attending church services, Gloria was also a door greeter, and continued to work alongside the Circle I women on many projects.

To Gloria Stresky, being a Presbyterian Woman has meant fellowship, community, devotion, comradery and purpose. Now at 96 years old and as the matriarch of both sides of their families, her advice to Presbyterian Women is to be "Be loving and committed to God, your family and friends, for you never know when there will be another sunrise."
