

Dear Ones,

The second Sunday in January is typically when we celebrate the baptism of Jesus Christ. It is a Sunday wholly dedicated to that scripture passage in whatever Gospel we are reading during that lectionary year (Mark, right now). I always enjoy that Sunday because I am reminded of my own baptism and all that the event entails as we read about Jesus. But an important part of our understanding of baptism in the Presbyterian tradition is that it is not only an individual event but also a communal one. Both the individual or the parents of the individual being baptized *and* the congregation make vows.

As we start a new year, it is a good time to remember the vows that we have made as congregants both to God and to each person that has been baptized in our church. These vows go like this:

Do you, as members of the church of Jesus Christ, promise to guide and nurture this child/person by word and deed, with love and prayer?

To which you respond, "I do." We then continue:

Will you encourage them to know and follow Christ and to be faithful members of his church?

To this you have responded, "I will."

The beauty of Christ's baptism is that God claims Jesus Christ as his beloved even in his earthly dwelling. So it is that God also claims us right here and right now also as beloved. Further, in the baptismal vows above, we claim our love and our nurture for one another in this event. Take time this week and try to remember any baptism you have been present at and at which you have made these vows. Take a moment to lift those persons in prayer, and if possible, to offer them encouragement as they seek to know and follow Jesus Christ. The gift of God's love is not only God's love for us but our sharing that love with one another.

The glow of the star fades, and the memory of the tree stays a little while longer.

The past year has been a trying one. It defiantly did not go as I had envisioned and planned, but it wasn't all bad. I got to spend more time with the kids. We played more games, did more baking, and laughed. It seemed like I could see Eli and Ottis growing before my eyes. Would I have had these opportunities with them? I may have, but would I have cherished them as much because "life" got in the way? These are examples of the thoughts that ran through my head as I looked at the Christmas tree.

The moments of playing cribbage with Eli, making cookies with Ottis, snuggling with Izzi, and watching TV with Craig are the little lights on my string of Christmas lights, flowing from the bright Christmas star, God's love. These sparks of love and sharing are what will anchor us in the chaos of the world around us. The love we share and the Heavenly Host will be the light in the darkness. When we are lost, we need to reach out to those little lights that help lead us up the string to the brightest one of all.

Finding the focus and the reflection time throughout the year is always a struggle for me, but I take comfort that I am not the only one. God put us in a community of believers to lift one another when we stumble. To direct our focus back to the bright shining Christmas star when the events surrounding us threaten to consume us. God sends us the little lights to remind us that love is what matters, and no one else loves us as much as God.

Mission Committee

Mission and Outreach met in December to finalize donations. A \$1,500 donation by our church to Habitat for Humanity will be matched by Thrivent Financial, who have contributed up to \$85,000 for the 2021 build campaign. We are stepping out as a leader in Habitat for Humanity in next year's building efforts. As the construction season begins and volunteers can once again work on homes, Mission will be soliciting for helpers in building projects.

Second, because of the generosity of our church family, Mission was able to write a check from the Angel Fund for \$1,500 to the Christmas Wish Campaign. Three hundred dollars was also donated to Tongue River Schools for student disposable masks.




