Dear Ones,

Each October we celebrate Reformation Sunday on the last Sunday of the month. This commemorates October 31, 1517, the day when the German monk Martin Luther nailed the Ninety-five Theses to the door of the church in Wittenberg. Luther did not intend for his actions to spur a completely new church separate from the Catholic church. His document was to point out reform he thought the church was in dire need of in order to be more faithful in its life and calling. However, the advent of the printing press aided the distribution of Luther's challenges and within two weeks the Ninety-Five Theses were widely distributed through Germany and throughout Europe within just a few months. Wide change was underway whether Luther intended it or not.

Over 500 years later, we Presbyterians owe our roots to this event. It is an event that shapes us. Just as Luther strove to reform the church, we name ourselves as part of the Reformed tradition. But we do not see ourselves as having got it right with one reformation. Rather, the phrase "ecclesia reformata semper reformanda" defines us as it means "the church reformed and always being reformed." We are a work in progress. And it is God who leads us. It is God who does this constant reforming. It is God who is always shaping and reshaping the church.

In adult Sunday school this month, we will take the five Sundays to look at church history through the lens of people who influenced the Christian faith from the earliest centuries to the present including the Reformers like Martin Luther and John Calvin (even more important for us Presbyterians). I am excited about this class and hope that, if you are not part of the adult Sunday school, that you might join us for the month of October at 9 AM in the Westminster Hall. As another Martin Luther noted (MLK, that is), "We are not makers of history. We are made by history." Each October, we recall that the events of that month in 1517 made us who we are in a lot of ways even if we might not realize it. And we also give thanks that God continues to make us who we are through Jesus Christ who was and is and is yet to be.

Have you noticed the current Christian Education board? It is a hub of information for all the CE offerings at church. The calendar will have all the Bible studies and Sunday school, youth group, and retreats listed. Below the calendar, there are four clipboards. Each clipboard holds fun things! The two closest to the parlor have youth bulletins. The one closest to the parlor is for the munchkins that can't read vet. The one next to that is for the readers. Each of these bulletins is based on the lectionary, and they have engaging activities for you (and adults too!). The clipboard following the children's bulletin has sermon notes. It is a great way to begin taking sermon notes or a fancier note form. Finally, the last clipboard has prayer cards. One side has a design you can color, and



the other side is where you write your prayer. I love these cards! You can hang them next to your bathroom mirror and lift a blessing while you brush your teeth. Or I slip mine in a cabinet in my kitchen and look at it while cooking supper or doing dishes.

While you are praying for your neighbor, sometimes you want to say a specific prayer for them, or do you have a prayer request that you want to share but don't want to announce. Under the bulletin is the prayer exchange or the prayer clothesline. On this line, you would take a card, write your prayer and hang it up. Then someone would take it and pray for you. Then place the card in an area where it could be seen as a reminder to pray the request. Then you could bring the card back, put it back on the line and get another one.

It feels great to hear the laughter of the LOGOS youth echoing through the church. LOGOS meets on Wednesday afternoon, starting at 3:30 pm for kindergarten through fifth-grade youth and 6 pm for sixth through twelfth grade. All children are welcomed. The LOGOS children will be participating in the Wednesday night Food with Families. If you have registered your child for LOGOS, they will automatically be included in the RSVP for dinner. Middle and high school students who attend will have a plate saved for them if they arrive after 6:15.

Youth Group will be starting on Sunday, October 10, and will meet every Sunday from 4-5 pm. The youth group is time for the sixth through twelfth grade to strengthen their faith by exploring scripture, questioning, reflection, mission work, and fellowship.

If you missed the Triennium informational meeting, no worries, it isn't too late! If you know someone in eighth through twelfth grade interested, please let me know, and we can get together. I think the youth were most interested in finding out that we will be staying in a hotel than the theme:)

Names of God:

This month we'll focus on the name **El Elyon** (el el-yone')— The Most High God.

Use in the Bible: In the Old Testament El **Elyon** occurs 28 times. It occurs 19 times in the Psalms. It is first used in Genesis 14:18. **El** is another name that is translated as "God" and can be used in conjunction with other words to designate various aspects of God's character. **Elyon** literally means "Most High" and is used both adjectivally and substantively throughout the Old Testament. It expresses the extreme sovereignty and majesty of God and His highest preeminence. When the two words are combined... **El Elyon**...it can be translated as "the most exalted God." (Psalm 57:2) Further references of the name **El Elyon** in the Old Testament: Gen 14;18; Gen 14:19; Gen 14:20, Gen 14:22; Psa 57:2; Psa 78:35. Psa 18:13; and one of my very favorites Psalm 91:1. Also Luke 1:32, 35, 76 and Luke 6:35. Some others references in the New Testament include: Mark 5:7; Luke 8:28; Acts 7:48; 16:17 and Hebrews 7:1!

FPC'S PIPE ORGAN INCLUDED IN RESEARCH PROJECT


