Adult Sunday School will start on January 9 with a three week study focused on:

Presbyterian Worship - Why We Do What We Do & Say

What We Say: Some of us grew up in the Presbyterian tradition and others of us have come to the tradition later in life. But all of us have questions about worship. In this class, we will explore the different aspects of Presbyterian worship, their origins, and their relevance. If you've ever wondered why we have a Call to Worship each week or why the communion table cloth and banners on the walls change colors through the year then this class is for you!

While wrestling with its difficult questions, this course hopes to show that the Old Testament is still relevant for modern Christians. Books are provided for this course for no cost.

Dear Ones,

Happy New Year! Of course, as I've noted before and also noted in the Pastor's Corner this last week, it is just the new year on our Gregorian calendar. The start of the new year on the Church's calendar begins with Advent (by Church, I mean the universal church, not our local congregation's fiscal year).

Regardless of calendar, it is a good time to take stock. A good time to be reminded of what is going on in the life of the church that can aid in your own spiritual formation and grow us together as a community of believers reaching into the wider community of which we are a part.

Sunday school for all ages kicks back off on January 9 at 9 AM. We have a K-4 class, junior high class, and adult class. The adult class will offer the following this coming "semester":

Presbyterian Worship: Why We Do What We Do and Say What We Say (January 9 – 23) Lies My Preacher Told Me: An Honest Look at the Old Testament (Jan 30 – Feb 28 Learning to Walk in the Dark (Advent Study Group meeting March 6 – April 10) Poverty in the 21st Century & Our Own Backyard (April 24 – May 15)

LOGOS kicks back off this week at 3:30 PM for our K-5 group and 6:30 PM for the Jr/Sr High. We resume Wednesday dinners this week from 5-6 PM. This is an amazing time for us to connect with one another midweek. Wednesday night Bible study will also resume this week at 6 PM. That study will pick up with Daniel and after finishing that book will begin looking each week at the text(s) for the upcoming Sunday.

We have two Thursday morning studies. The 7 AM study is looking at the book of Acts and resumes on the 13th. The 10 AM is led by Jeri Joy and you can contact her for more information about it. Our PW groups also continue in fellowship and study together on the first and third Wednesdays of the month.

It is also important that we engage in allowing the work of the head to inform the work of our hearts. That is to say that the spiritual formation that happens in our studies should guide our hands and feet forward in the work of Christ in our world. Our church continues to engage with Lunch Together and the Food Group. We need hands and hearts open to service with these opportunities. We fill the Little Free Pantry outside the church office multiple times each week and watch as that food goes to those in need.

Service also happens at the church. If you'd like to be engaged in worship as a reader or usher you can visit with John Jackson. Our various committees are deeply committed to the work of the church, carrying out so much of our mission and ministry behind the scenes and with little fanfare. Each is looking for people who desire to serve and these committees are also fertile grounds for growth in understanding our church and in supporting Christ's work in the world. Our youth, too, need support from those who feel called to teach and walk alongside them in Sunday school and LOGOS.

I am thankful for the ways we continue to learn, to serve, to worship, and to grow together. We have dealt with nearly two years of adapting and that time of adaptation does not yet look to be over. But we have persevered. I am thankful to all of you for doing that. I am thankful for your support of our congregation and for your engagement in Sheridan together. As we come into this new year and our programming starts up again, I encourage you to not only continue in your engagement but to seize the opportunities we have to try new ways to grow spiritually and to serve those whom Christ loves.

Recently, FPC's Session worked to create a Purpose Statement & Responsibilities for each of the Session's committees.

Mission Committee Purpose Statement

The Mission Committee of FPC Sheridan guides the congregation in being the hands and feet of Jesus by providing opportunities for service and giving beyond our own church doors.

Communication & Technology Committee Purpose Statement

The committee's purpose is to advise and support all committees and Session on the use of technology, information systems, and other devices as needed.

Properties Committee Purpose Statement

The purpose of the Properties Committee of First Presbyterian Church (FPC) is to provide systems and programs to ensure the safe and proper use of the facilities and to provide for the performance of all necessary maintenance and repairs of the building and grounds.

Budget, Finance, and Stewardship Committee Purpose Statement

Monitor the financial health of First Presbyterian Church of Sheridan, WY. Also promote opportunities for increased giving to the Presbyterian Church and missions worldwide.

Fellowship Committee Purpose Statement


