Per Capita Contributions

Per capita contributions are required of churches by our higher councils (Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly). These contributions connect us to the wider work of the church by supporting the denomination's efforts at domestic and international levels. Last year, our per capita dues totaled \$12,819.30. We had members give \$4,073.65 in per capita contributions additional to their tithes and offerings. That meant the remainder was paid from the general budget. One of the easiest ways to increase your giving and for us to help out the budget is to make your per capita contribution of \$45 in addition to your annual giving. We have budgeted this year for members to contribute \$3000 toward our per capita expenses. Every bit we are over this helps an incredible amount! Thank you for your generosity and consideration of per capita support!

Dear Ones,

Last month, Harper Jo and I had the pleasure of visiting Mary Holstedt in her apartment at Elmcroft. It was a joyous moment in which our oldest member and our most newly baptized were able to meet for the first time. I've been reflecting on this visit often since and have been giving thanks to God for the multi-generational nature of the church and the enduring aspects of God's love that welcome young and old alike. In short, I'm thankful for the tie that binds.

Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love; the fellowship of kindred minds is like to that above. – Verse 1 of "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" by John Fawcett (1782)

I love to reflect on the idea that the Church is a gift to us. Our friendship with one another, the binding of hearts in Jesus Christ, and the opportunity to share life together in deep and meaningful ways that faith allows are something given by God above. As the hymn notes, to share this gift with one another ("fellowship of kindred minds") is to glimpse the Kin-dom of God ("is like to that above"). Was it anything but a glimpse of this when Mary and Harper Jo – almost 100 years apart in age – met with an already obvious connection to one another in Jesus Christ? Where else but in God can we find that?

We share our mutual woes, our mutual burdens bear, and often for each other flows the sympathizing tear. (Verse 3)

As the hymn continues, we are reminded that to be bound together in Christ means something. Our binding changes us. It makes us compassionate and attentive to one another. It lifts our eyes from our own feet to the faces of those walking the road alongside us. These faces are all ages and from all places but bound together by God's love and therefore called to love one another. What a gift to be together as such. To be created not just for God but for one another. And what a joy to have moments that remind us of this that call us to gratitude for that gift and to service for one another.

Thank you all for walking the road together. Thank you for loving one another even when its difficult. Thank you for serving one another. Thank you for helping to make the gift of the Church known to the world so that it is not hoarded but a place all can be invited to discover the tie that binds.

Awe February, the month that has been dubbed the month of love. The title came about thanks to St. Valentine. Have you ever gone down the rabbit hole of the history behind Valentine's Day? Hello Hsitory.com, down the rabbit hole I went. It was exciting and educational!

The man himself, St. Valentine, was a martyr for the church. But, did you know that there is a question around who the true Valentine was? The Catholic Church recognizes three St. Valentines. Two of the saints have very similar deaths close together. One legend claims the holiday was named after the Valentine who defied Emperor Claudius II. Emperor Claudius believed that unmarried men made better soldiers, marriages were outlawed. Valentine married young couple, and as his punishment, he was beheaded. The other claim to the holiday fame is a story about another martyr named Saint Valentine of Terni. Emperor Claudius II also beheaded this Valentine. His crime, he helped Christians escape imprisonment where they were being tortured and killed. It is also rumored that he wrote the first "valentine" letter to one of his guard's daughter.

The holiday evolved over the years. The love, cards, and candy part of Valentine's Day came later. Many scholars believe that a 1375 poem, "Parliament of Fouls" by English poet Geoffrey Chaucer, morphed the holiday to love. A line in the poem states on St. Valentine's Day, the bird will pick its mate. People took that line and went wild. This idea of choosing a mate inspired Richard Cadbury. I am sure you all know the Cadbury name. Richard Cadbury lived during the 19th century and introduced the box of chocolate to the world and marketed it as a Valentine's Day gift. With that, the holiday became commercialized. It is now the second-largest card giving/sending holiday in the world.

Jesus teaches us to love our neighbor. However, I am pretty confident that Jesus did not have Valentine's Day in mind when he gave that instruction. Yes, Jesus healed, cast out demons, turned water into wine, and brought the dead back to life. These were big attention grabbers, but he also did the little things. He listened, solved problems, cried with those who were morning, and he taught us. When I talk to my kids, I tell them that love is grand, but the little things make up the feeling. Love is all-encompassing and covers so many emotions. 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 tells us that all that loves are; patience, kindness, isn't jealous, doesn't brag, or rude. It doesn't say anything about grace but doesn't grace cover many of those things? Grace is freely given without strings and is unconditional love. It is through grace that you can forgive. 
