Holy Week Schedule

Palm Sunday, April 10th

Worship at 8 am and 10:30 am with our traditional palm branches and music from the Bell Choir.

PW will have pie by the slice available from 9 - 10:30 am and again from 11:30 am - 12:30 pm this day.

Maundy Thursday, April 14th

Worship service at 7 pm will be "in the round" and will feature a tolling of the bell with chanted music. There will be communion by intinction.

Good Friday, April 15th

First Presbyterian Church sanctuary will be open all day for private prayer. There will be an Ecumenical service at 12 pm at First Christian Church, 102 S. Connor St.

Easter Sunday, April 17th

Easter Sunrise service will be held at 6 am on the patio by the Fellowship Hall with fellowship time to follow.

Easter worship will be held at our regular time of 8 am and 10:30 am services.

From 9 am - 10:30 am the men's group will be serving Easter breakfast.

Sunday school, choir, Senior Survival, and Youth Group will <u>NOT</u> be meeting on Easter Sunday.

If you would like to bring in an Easter lily for Easter Sunday in memory or in honor of a loved one, please drop them off at the church by Wednesday, April 13th.

Dear Ones,

The passion of Jesus Christ is known to us in the week of his (ironically) celebratory ride into Jerusalem, his final dinner with his disciples, his betrayal, death, and resurrection. It is a week that is certainly "holy" for we encounter God in the depths of the human experience in these events. This year, Holy Week is April 10 - 17, and we will worship at the following times:

April 10 - Palm Sunday services (8 AM & 10:30 AM)

April 14 - Maundy Thursday service w/ Communion (7 PM)

April 15 - Ecumenical Good Friday service (12 PM @ First Christian Church)

April 17 - Easter Sunrise service (6 AM on Fellowship Hall patio)

April 17 - Easter services (8 AM & 10:30 AM)

I would encourage you to take part in each service as you are able for it is in all the events of Holy Week that we most deeply encounter the crucified and resurrected Christ. In addition to the services, the sanctuary will be open and set up for individual prayer from 8 AM - 12 PM on the morning of Good Friday. We will also enjoy an Easter breakfast provided by the men of the church between services on Easter. If you are helping with this event, please show up at 7:30 AM. If you plan to eat, come anytime between 9 and 10:30. There will be plenty for all!

With the practical pieces aside, I want to touch for a moment on a particularly fascinating piece of what it is God takes on in the events of Holy Week: *suffering*. I visited the other day with some of the other pastors in town and we wondered about Jesus' suffering. How necessary is his suffering in death? Could a Jesus who died of old age served the same purposes?

In short, yes, it is necessary. Jesus' suffering is instrumental to what God accomplished. But there is a tension in trying to answer a question around the nature of the cross and resurrection because there is a mystery to all of these events. They mean many things given the far-reaching implications of God's love poured out. We might note that for Christ to suffer is to share more than life and even more than death with humanity. To suffer is to enter the deepest part of the human experience in order to walk with us in every shadowy valley. This suffering is poured out in humiliation upon the cross as Jesus is betrayed, spat upon, and murdered even at the hands of those who were religious. In the resurrection, Jesus suffers love for our sake. That is, he pushes through what is sick and ugly, sinful and broken, all on our behalf, going beyond these things in order to accept them and heal them. He suffers the love of one who is bound by it. For Jesus, there is no other way but love for us. But all we can do is note observations of his suffering, explore it, and be in awe of it. We cannot define it perfectly because we do not know God perfectly. But God knows us! And God pours out Jesus Christ for us! The gifts of Holy Week tell this remarkable story even in their mystery for we cannot fully grasp God's amazing grace. But we can thank God for the indescribable love that will not let us go!

Every March and April, I get the gardening itch. I want to get my hands dirty. I want to start the seeds for my flowers and vegetables. The yard calls my name to come out and rake, seed, and make it look pretty. I want to do everything to make my yard beautiful and my garden bountiful. I pull from my experience growing up and helping my grandmother with her garden. I remember her starting her seeds in an old sheet pan with clear plastic wrap over the top to create a mini greenhouse. My paternal grandmother told me to plant potatoes on Good Friday because the soil needs to be cool still for the potatoes to sprout. I remember my maternal grandfather, the farmer, saying, "Ho, Ho, my girl, you need to make sure you rotate your crops to keep the soil good." Their tidbits of information still echo through my ears this time of year.

I have the trusty gardening book that I pull out every year. It has tips and hints for each month or so many weeks from the last frost date to help get my garden ready for the next growing season. My handy dandy notebook is where I keep my garden layout from year to year to make sure I am rotating my crops.

I am always collecting new ideas for landscaping and tricks for my garden. You should see my Pinterest boards. Craig shudders when I say, "Hey look what I found for the yard (or garden) on Pinterest," because he knows I have something for him to do.

As gardeners, we can always find someone to talk with, share ideas, and mentor, but it is more challenging to talk about faith. I can remember going to church with both of my grandparents. Sitting next to them in church, one was Presbyterian and the other Methodist, singing hymns. But I cannot remember either one of them talking to me about their faith or religious beliefs—the same for my parents. My parents helped with spelling words, making sure we read--the Book It program was the best and did homework. We talked about the world around us, and as my brother and I got older, the topics expanded and became more complex. Unless we had specific religious questions, I don't remember any teaching from them besides making sure we went to Sunday school, church, youth group, and reading the Chronicles of Narnia.

Parents and grandparents are the number one faith influencers in a child's life. That thought can be daunting. Where do you start? Maybe your early faith exposure wasn't that in-depth, or you came to the faith later in life. You are not alone. One of the many blessings we are given is the church. We are here to love and support parents and children. We all have a point we need to start at. On Sunday, April 24, following the 10:30 service, the CE Committee, Pastor Karl, and I are hosting a round table session. We want to hear your vision, successes, needs, and struggles in sharing and talking about faith. Childcare will be available during our meeting.

I came across this quote while reading the other day, "Christians who shape the spiritual lives of children are shaping the spiritual landscape of the future." We are. It isn't just the parent's responsibility. Fuller Youth Institute, based out of Fuller Seminary, found that a child who has at least five nonfamily members involved in their faith development has a stronger faith than those who have fewer.

Just like planning and caring for my garden and yard doesn't just happen in the Spring. Christian development is a year-round effort. Take the next couple of months to pray and consider where you can be a faith influence in the life of the families and children of the church. There are many different areas in which you can be involved, and it isn't just teaching. I would invite conversations to explore your place as a landscaper.

PW Mission Pledge supports PW Mission in the Presbyterian Church USA.


Local PW Mission supports different local missions annually. Some groups supported in the past are:

Sign up sheets and menus are on the board in the narthex and also available <u>here</u> on SignUp Genius.


If you miss the signups, call the church office by noon on Monday prior to the Wednesday meal and we will add you to the reservations.
