Dear Ones,

As Christians, we believe in the Triune God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – three-in-one and one-inthree. As God is beyond us, the nature of God is similarly impossible to comprehend entirely by human reason alone. We are apt to confess ancient heresies whenever we try to explain the Trinity or use a metaphor for such. We can only understand the Trinity by faith which is, in and of itself, a statement made by faith. Perhaps the best we can believe and confess is that where one person of the Trinity is, there are all three, and there is God.

In the biblical witness, however, we understand the characteristics of God as we understand the particular workings of each person of the Trinity. Given that Pentecost is this coming Sunday (don't forget to wear red!), we have an opportunity before us to explore, ponder, and find ourselves in awe at the workings of the Holy Spirit through the history of humanity, the life of the church, and our own experiences and lives.

At Pentecost, we remember the story in Acts when the Holy Spirit descended upon the early church and gave them the gift to communicate with one another in different languages. As the book of Acts continues, the church continues in this same power of the Holy Spirit going forward to spread the gospel in other ways: their radical life together and care for each other, faithful witness in the face of persecution, miraculous healings, and faithful discernment with one another concerning who and what would be allowed in the church. In all aspects, through the power of the Holy Spirit, the early church is able to keep a focus on Jesus Christ.

In our lives, we share the Lord's Supper each month. In the Reformation of the 1500s, one theological difference between people was the understanding of how we are united with Jesus Christ in the sharing of the bread and the cup. In our tradition, John Calvin noted that the Holy Spirit does this. We are not united with Jesus because the bread and the cup are his physical body and blood; we are united with our Redeemer because the Holy Spirit lifts us into the presence of Christ at the heavenly banquet with believers in all times and places.

The early church and the Eucharist give us an initial insight into the Holy Spirit; the Holy Spirit keeps us in the power of Jesus Christ and binds us to our Redeemer as if some sort of cosmic and holy glue (that one isn't exactly a theological term). The Holy Spirit puts Christ's teachings before us and gives us the courage and endurance to pick up our cross and follow. When Jesus says, in the book of John, that the Holy Spirit will come and names the Spirit "the Advocate," this is what he means. The Spirit advocates for faithful witness in our lives.

This is a glimpse at what the Spirit does. The Spirit also brings peace. At Jesus' baptism, the Spirit descends upon him. In the Old Testament, the Spirit hovers over the chaos of the waters at creation. The Spirit is also seen as the breath of God which God then places into humankind to bring life - another binding with the divine. And don't forget the dry bones.

Through June, we are going to focus on the Holy Spirit in worship. The Worship Committee has been shaping our space to help us explore, and the work they have done is fantastic! I am excited about diving into the work of the Spirit even as the Spirit is at work!

Why does it seem that time hits the fast forward button as you get older? It seems like yesterday I was tucking my babies in and reading bedtime stories. We just celebrated minion number two's graduation and preparing for her to move 700 miles away to start college. There have been many happy tears shed, and so far, only a few out of panic from her claiming that she isn't ready. Oh, but you are little one. You are strong in your faith and love of God. You know you are wrapped by prayers and the love of your family and friends. I am confident that your faith will remain strong as you venture out into the world.

Watching Izabel grow, I see the mannerisms and traits of her parents. The good ones she got from me. The bad ones are from Craig. Most of the time, we didn't say, "Izabel this is what you do...." she just observed. Her love for reading she got from me. I can always be found with at least two books that I am actively reading. I remember joking with her fifth-grade teachers that if she ever came to school with a bruise on her head, it was because she wouldn't put her book down long enough to walk from room to room. They responded that it goes the same for school because she was the same way there. Her sense of humor, mine. Her love for true crime, Craig. Her love of God and church, both of us.

In her lifetime, Izabel has witnessed how Craig and I lived out our faith. When we moved to a new town, we always looked for a church. As a result, we became active in the life of the church. We started the kids in Sunday school, youth activities and volunteered. Many of our first friendships in a new town sprang up from the church. When a crisis hits, she sees how the church surrounds and supports each other. I firmly believe that these observations and experiences led to her asking me how to find a church. I have to admit that did make this mama's heart swell.

I came across a book called Households of Faith, published by Barna Group. One of the main points was that meaningful and positive faith interactions lay a foundation for lasting faith into adulthood. Families, whatever they may look like, that show spiritual practices are prevalent in all that they do. The interactions lead to heart-to-heart talks, games, reading, singing, or all aspects of life. This energy is contagious when the family shows hospitality to others. Spiritual practices can be as simple as saying Grace at mealtime to talking about God's sightings-where you saw God during your day, bedtime prayers, and reading the Bible. These simple conversations or observations evolve and grow as they become more normalized in the house.

Barna Group talked about how households are not necessarily a typical family unit in today's society. There are multigenerational households, nuclear families, single-parent families, empty nesters, roommates, or a variety of combinations. Each household holds the same influences on the individual spiritual expression.

When we gather as the family of God, whether it is in fellowship, worship, education, or in passing, we are offering an experience. What type is up to us. Either way, it could last a lifetime.


