Dear Ones,

As you have likely picked up, I enjoy the church calendar. I like the progression through the seasons of Advent and Lent. Pentecost is a wonderful celebration that helps us be reminded of the power of the Spirit upon which the church was founded. Remembering Christ's own baptism each year helps us embrace our own calling in baptism. In short, the church year functions in a beautiful way to keep us in the story of God again and again because this is the great story of humankind made, redeemed, and sustained by our Triune God.

The longest season of the church calendar is called "Ordinary Time." It is the time that stretches from Pentecost until Advent. We sit in the beginning of Ordinary Time right now. There is, however, nothing ordinary about it. During this stretch of the church calendar, we are immersed in the stories of Jesus' life: the healings, the controversies, the meals, and the miracles. These stories, in turn, tell us of and call us to discipleship. We see how Jesus walked this earth so that we might do the same. But in following the church calendar, we see all of this after having first celebrated the incarnation and Christ's coming to us at Advent/Christmas (the beginning of the church year), the death and resurrection of Christ during Lent/Easter, and then the giving of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The seasons are shaped in this way so that we might see that we come to the work of discipleship with Christ already beside us (Advent/Christmas), having already redeemed us (Lent/Easter), and having already given us the Spirit with which to strengthen us in this journey (Pentecost).

What amazing news this is! There is nothing we have to earn before God to be worthy of walking in the way of Jesus Christ. There is nothing to prove. We have already been prepared to do so in every single way!

We hear of this great love and our own preparation to follow many times in the Assurance of Grace during worship as Paul's words from Romans are repeated, "God demonstrates love for us like this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." There is truly nothing more we need. All that we are and all that we can be is wrapped up in God's great love for us already given in Jesus Christ.

As we read the stories of Jesus' life through this season of Ordinary Time, I hope that you hear them knowing that God has prepared you already to follow in this way. God has called you and goes with you. God has equipped you already even when it is unbeknownst. Most of all, though, God's love is already there for you. It is there to help you grow. And that brings us around to the church calendar again for the color of Ordinary Time is green.

You have Dora's best friend Boots, the monkey, and her trusty backpack that carries all kinds of useful items and Map - the one to show you how to get to the final destination. Then you have the antagonist, Swiper the fox. You had to shout, "Swiper, no swiping," three times to stop him from taking things that didn't belong to him.

Brenden, Izabel, and Eli LOVED Dora. They would always ask to watch it. I think the older two even had Dora-themed birthday parties. Izabel had bedding, curtains, toys, and clothing with Dora on them. I think we watched every episode like 50 minion times. Well, maybe not that many, but it should did feel like it.

In one episode, Benny the Bull, Dora's friend, is in a hot air balloon with a hole. Benny is calling out, "Sticky tape! I need sticky tape!". Dora and the crew armed with Map follow Benny to encourage him to hang on and rush to get him his sticky tape.

Benny and his hot air balloon adventure remind me of a faith journey. You are just floating along, enjoying life and pop, and you go all topsy-turvy. You feel like you are alone, and you call out. As Benny calls out "sticky tape," you are calling out "sticky faith!" so you don't feel like you are lost in the process.

Benny isn't alone on this adventure, and neither are you. You have the church just as Benny has Dora and Boots following and supporting him. So when we don't know where the Spirit will lead, you have the church to call out to and hold you up until you find your way.

The church is a strong support system to call on. It isn't the four walls that make up the church but the people in it. When someone calls out for "sticky tape, " many people answer the call. It isn't in the cry for help but also in joyous celebration. Sharing birthdays, graduations, engagements, births, new jobs, and all the little things that build the relationships. Through these relationships, we know when we call out, our support system will be following us. We have faith that in every situation, God will send us a Dora and Boots to see us through and the Bible as our Map.

The love of the Trinity flows through us all. It assists in the sticky together of Their love and the love for one another. It's that stickiness that binds us all together. The stickiness that we share can start with the littlest among the church and spread to the more seasoned. It happens in the big events but also in the little ones, like sitting around after worship eating goodies, teaching Sunday school, or participating in a fellowship event. Make an effort to get sticky. You won't regret if!


