Blessing of the Bags

Sunday, August 21 at the 10:30 am worship service.

Bring your backpack, purse, diaper bag, laptop case or whatever type of bag you use to receive a special blessing as we prepare to kick off a new school year. Dear Ones,

I do not know where the summer went but it is no longer a waxing moon; it is clearly waning. However, that presents excitement for the upcoming program year. I want to outline some of what our various committees have been planning for you to be engaged in more ways than solely Sunday worship in the coming year.

After conversation with many of our families and lots of discernment by the Christian Education and Fellowship Committees, our Wednesday night dinners and programming will be shifting to Thursday evenings. Dinner will be held from 5:30 PM to 6:30 PM. Following that fellowship together, those who desire can shift to programming opportunities for all ages. The adults will continue a lectionary based Bible study looking at the Scripture from the previous Sunday and offering reflections on the sermon before taking a quick peek at the week ahead. Our children and youth programming will be an hour that offers opportunities for study, play, and the development of worship skills (such as bells and singing). This is an exciting new night for our church and it will be terrific for all ages to share in a meal with one another and then study simultaneously. Thursday evening programming will begin on September 15.

We will also continue with our 9:00 AM Sunday school hour. Our elementary aged class will expand to include Pre-K ages and split between our two connected classrooms as needed. Junior High Sunday school will be offered in the youth room and our high school aged youth will be encouraged to lend their voices to the adult discussion we will begin calling "Sunday Forum." The "Sunday Forum" will most often be topical discussions with each topic spanning three to four weeks (as currently formatted). This fall's topics will include:

- Simon Peter
- Help, Thanks, Wow: A Discussion on Prayer
- Matthew's Nativity (An Advent Study)

Sunday Forum will begin at 9 AM on September 11. A comprehensive course catalog will be available that morning listing all of the discussions through the fall semester and their dates.

These are just some of the exciting opportunities for us to grow together in discipleship over the next few months. The Thursday morning Bible study will also begin at 7 AM on August 25 and look at the Gospel of John.

I want to encourage you to pray about where the Spirit might be leading you to engage and grow in more ways than just Sunday worship. Jesus tells us in the Gospel of Luke, "Humankind does not live by bread alone." To immerse ourselves in study together and to discuss and to discover the Spirit at work are not only hallmarks of the Judeo-Christian tradition but are vital for our own growth as followers of Christ and compassionate and loving human beings. As we immerse ourselves in God's Word and explore what the Word holds for the world, we gain insights into who we have been created to be as God's beloved ones.

This week my photo memories are popping up with pictures of Triennium six and three years ago, and my calendar reminder told me I should be there again. But, I am sitting at my desk writing this and preparing for the Zephyr Point adventure with the youth. It is something new for everyone, and the excitement is there but different than preparing for Triennium.

Each time we prepare for Triennium, we have a comfort level of knowing we are going to Purdue University with the hope of getting in an air-conditioned dorm. Worship times will start with energizers transitioning into music and worship centered around the daily theme. We'll spend time in large mixed groups to discuss the experience that they are having. Throw some time with our Wyoming delegation filled with laughter, friendships, and memory-making moments. Leaving Sheridan, you know you will have fun. As a chaperone, I will see the awe of youth experiencing things for the first time, from flying to worshipping with over 3,000 youth to a taste of college life. There is also the excitement of the unknown because each time is a unique experience. The wonder of who the roommate will be, fear of getting lost, the energy of worship, and the fast pace of Triennium.

I feel like Zephyr Point will be the exact opposite of Triennium. Looking at the temperatures, they will be drastically different. Where Triennium is a high-energy fast pace, ZP will be a stop and soak in the moment. Triennium is flashy and loud, and ZP will be quiet and scenic. Worship won't be a production, but by the lake shore and peaceful. We will have an opportunity to put the daily scripture into practice with faith labs.

I believe that even though these experiences will be drastically different, they each have a place in faith development. To fully develop a faith, you need to have various experiences. At different times in our life, we will experience phases that are fast, chaotic, flashy, and wild. Then there will be times when it is quiet, peaceful, and laid back. No matter what phase you find yourself in, God will be there. These experiences and opportunities for the youth will equip them with skills that will last a lifetime.

The experience is a piece in the bigger picture we are building in the faith lives of the youth. Each piece, retreats, camps, Sunday school, confirmation, church, LOGOS, and conversations, strengthen the faith puzzle. Faith blossoms and grows all through their life when they all click together.

In the coming months, there will be several opportunities for families of all shapes, sizes, and ages to come together to experience time together. Saturday, August 13, is the annual pool party. We will gather at Kendrick Pool from 10 am -12 pm to celebrate summer. I don't want to say the end of summer because it doesn't seem like it should be August. I know it will be a fun time for all! Grab your towel, pool toys, and see you on Saturday, August 13.

Sunday, August 21, at the 10:30 service, we will be doing the Blessings of the Bag. The Blessing is an opportunity for anyone who uses a bag to bring them to worship and share the blessings for the coming year.

Amy Turpin has recently taken the position of Director of Performance Improvement at Sheridan Memorial Hospital.






