


Dear Ones,

The word "advent" is from the Latin "ad venire" meaning "to come." The church year begins with Advent because all of what we do as a church and in our lives begins with God coming to us. God takes the initiative not only to create us but to redeem and sustain our broken lives and world in Jesus Christ and to continue with us until this work is complete. Everything begins with God. Advent sets up the whole of the church year and its movement through the life of Jesus and sets up our own lives as those who seek to follow him by giving us a time to prepare for and to open our hearts to the Holy One who comes.

But what does this preparation look like? How do we open our hearts?

I wonder if our cue on this doesn't come from Jesus Christ, himself. We draw near. Proximity is a powerful thing. God chose close proximity to us in Jesus Christ because love is known most powerfully and most fully when it is near. The love of God that arrives in a dirty stable and rests in a little manger is vulnerable and close. It is accessible and understandable. It is the tangible love of a God who does not leave us on our own but wishes to be with us in all of the divine power, glory, and possibility.

So, in this season, make sure to light your candles on the darkest nights and let the light of God shine for no darkness separates us from Jesus Christ's close proximity. Lift your voices in song even on the coldest mornings, when your breath cuts the air and the air cuts your breath, because we draw near to God when we join the melody that creation has always been singing. Volunteer at Lunch Together. Offer something to the person on the street corner in need. Jesus's own coming to us shows that transformation only happens when we draw near. No issue that plagues the world, such as poverty or hunger, will ever change if the ones who are rich and fed keep their distance.

"Ad venire." To come. Thanks be to God for coming to us in Jesus Christ because that is what makes it possible for us to come near to one another, across all of the barriers we and our world have set up, and to share in Christ's unending, unconditional, and transforming love with open hearts.

I am a sucker for traditions. We have several at our house. For birthdays, the person we celebrate gets to pick their meal and dessert. Around Christmas, we have several more. One of them is that we get something to read. The kids' books have changed over the years: Eric Carle or Fancy Nancy morphed into graphic novels and true crime stories. One child requested audiobooks so they could listen to them while they worked.

Several of the books the kids and Craig were given were weekly devotions, yearly Bible journals, or little prayer books. For some reason, I loved the idea that they would be given a spiritual practice that would transcend over the year and not just end on Christmas morning. If the idea of gifting a parent or buying one for yourself a prayer book, I have stumbled across two books I wish I had sooner: *Ordinary Blessings for Parents* by Meta Herrick Carlson and *To Light Their Way* by Kayla Craig. They are both filled with prayers for everyday and special events.

To Light Their Way, prayers are longer. I go to this one when I have more time to read and meditate. After each prayer, the scripture that inspires the prayer is listed. *To Light Their Way* also has prayers for holidays and holy days. It also has breathing prayers, which I love. One of the breathing prayer is INHALE: You are tender and merciful. EXHALE: Guide me to the path of peace. As I write this and think about the breathing prayers, I might start putting them on sticky notes and leaving them in places where I need them.


Ordinary Blessings for Parents: Prayers, Poems, and Meditations for Family Life is another one that I am enjoying. This one has short little prayers. This one has prayers you say over the child, while *To Light Your Way* is more prayers to share with God. Ordinary Blessings has something for every stage of development. They even have a prayer for when a child moves out. This book does not have any holiday or holy day prayers, but Meta Herrick Carlson does have a book explicitly dedicated to Christmas, Ordinary Blessings for the Christmas Season.

I have all three in my office or my backpack if you want to look at them. As the Advent season gets going, don't forget to cherish the memories and the continued traditions. I will leave you with a prayer from the *Ordinary Blessings for the Christmas Season* by Meta Herrick Carlson.


