Dear Ones,

It's been a terrific 2023 at First Presbyterian Church! Let's take a look back: We began the year making a big change. At the annual meeting, you all approved the Session's recommendation to change the by-laws to move the Session from a 21 member council to a 12 member council. This change followed a year of work by a dedicated task force (made up of Beth Thurow, Craig Clem, Shelley Cundiff, and Nancy Cook) who sought to discern what sort of leadership structure would best fit our congregation in the 2020s and going forward.

January gave way to February which paved the way for our first "Bluegrass Sunday." If you all had even half as much fun as I did at that special worship service then you had A LOT of fun! It was a Sunday full of old favorites and even foot stamping and hand clapping. Who says Presbyterians are always the frozen chosen? I'm so grateful to Loren Ruttinger, Erica Bainter, Greg Thurow, and Kathy Beagle for sharing their musical skills with us all on that day. Our next "Bluegrass Sunday" will be on January 28. I hope to see you there!

As we moved into the spring, we embraced the Lenten season with a freezing cold Ash Wednesday. But twenty below didn't deter all of you! I couldn't believe how many people still came out or joined online to embrace the humility of both the liturgical season and just being human. At the end of the season, you all came out again for one of our favorite services: Maundy Thursday. We circled around the communion table and lived the story of Jesus sitting down with his fickle disciples and sitting down with our fickle selves today. On Easter, we watched the sun come up, ate breakfast through the morning, and proclaimed, "Jesus Christ is risen today!"

In the summer, you gave your time and skills to Camp Story (which had a banner year). Our youth took a mission trip to Kansas City to serve and grow together. We hosted Mark and Miriam from Frontera de Cristo and growing that partnership even more as a delegation from our church is with them on the border as you read this. We golfed, ate, and hiked together. We enjoyed the beautiful gift of church family.

In the fall, we journeyed through Exodus together in worship. We cleaned the church and the highway (for the 33rd straight year...I think). Our bell choir got back up and going on a weekly basis. Our choir continued to share their gifts with us. We gathered mid-week at The Bridge to eat together and connect between Sundays, and various Bible studies grew in their faith together. Then, in the past month, we celebrated the Advent season and wondered together, "How does a weary world rejoice?" We held the sorrows of the season together in prayer and at the special Longest Night service, and we shared our joys as we enjoyed the choir's leadership in worship and the children's with their pageant (the first of that sort in a number of years).

I am so grateful for all of you and your faithful participation in this faith community and beyond it. You joined your hearts and hands together for another year of service at Lunch Together feeding this town and continued to expand your work of feeding with support of our Little Free Pantry. You gave generously to support our ministry within the church. Your gifts also allowed us to help many people who came to the church looking for help with gas, lodging, food, medical bills, and utility bills. When people have come in, we have done our best to help and to find ways to help. This is what gives me great hope about this congregation for that is directly related to the way in which we have grown to make space for all who come into worship. I firmly believe that this is a place where people can find a home and a family that embraces them as Christ embraces them. Is there yet work to do in our own hearts on that front? Of course, but we are looking to Jesus to guide our way and we are seeking to be faithful and hopeful. Considering all of this, it is a joy to walk with you into 2024.

We were given a star with a word on it a year ago. We were instructed to use that word to guide, reflect, and grow from. The word I had was comprehension. I wrote it on my whiteboard so I would reflect on the word every day when sitting at my desk. Here we are a year later, and I still need help with my word.

Comprehension means to understand and fully grasp something or a concept. I first thought there was no way I would fully understand my faith. I will always question, ponder, and wonder at the scriptures I study. When I feel I know the passage's meaning, something or someone comes along and has me reexamine what I thought I knew. I love that we share and discuss scripture. Through these experiences, I am continually growing and learning, but what can I get from comprehension?

Reflecting on what I did this year, I find my brain wandering back to July when I took Eli and Prakash on a mission trip to Kansas City. We served in a thrift store, helped with a community garden, and tended a garden that helped finance educational programs to help low-income families grow their produce. We were in an unfamiliar town doing tasks we could do at home, but we were experiencing the people and the stories behind the faces. This experience gave me another perspective on the commandment to go and be the hands and feet of God.

As I write this, I am packing to travel with the delegation to experience Frontera de Cristo and the mission partners. I will witness the impact of the service. I can walk the desert between the United States and Mexico. I will experience a different culture and life from Sheridan, Wyoming. These experiences will expand my comprehension of a different life and how God works in all of it and through us all to experience the love of the Creator.

This past year, comprehension played out as seeing faith in action. Experiences that expanded, grew, shaped, and transformed my faith. Comprehension of what it means to serve others in body, mind, and shared experiences. It took a year to comprehend how comprehension could be embraced in my life entirely. Here is hoping this year's word is more straightforward.

2024 will have two mission opportunities. The high school students will be able to participate in a mission trip to Benton Harbor, MI, in June. The middle school students will have a mission opportunity in July that will stay closer to home. One of the big fundraisers for these opportunities and the camping scholarship will be this month, in the form of the annual chili cook-off and silent auction. The chili cookoff will be held on Sunday, January 21 following the 10:30 service. The chili cook-off starts the silent auction, concluding the following Sunday.

Please let me know if you would like to participate in the chili cook-off by Wednesday, January 17. January 17 is also the last day to drop off donations for the silent auction. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact me.

2024 is shaping up to be a year full of adventure and faith-building opportunities for the youth.

The PW luncheon is Wednesday, January 10th at noon.






