Dear Ones,

Harper Jo and I like to play hide and seek. She is not exactly a strong hider. Her hiding spots are obvious. If she does manage to fully conceal herself then she begins to giggle and gives herself away. Yet, no matter how easy she is to find, I love playing this game. There is a thrill in being the seeker, getting to whatever number it is you are counting to, and shouting, “Ready or not! Here I come!” Then, there is the tingle of excitement as you reach for a closet door and throw it open hoping to see who you are seeking (assuming they can stay quiet). The chase is so much fun that it almost feels like a let down to me when I find Harper Jo and we switch.

The work of our spiritual development in the Christian faith is much like a game of hide and go seek. God is not hidden from us, but we are not able to know God fully. We are always seeking after God. As Henri Nouwen puts it, “Theological formation is the gradual and often painful discovery of God’s incomprehensibility. You can be competent in many things, but you cannot be competent in God.”

Yet, we still seek. It is a gift to look for God with one another, to share our insights, our gleanings, and the ways in which the Spirit is working as we study. I love it when we are at the tables in Sunday school sharing varying opinions, coming to different conclusions, noticing different things in the Bible, and holding one another lightly and in love as we do all of that.

With summer approaching, Sunday school is winding down for a few months, but there will be other study opportunities for you. I would encourage you to keep your eyes on the calendar and announcements to see what is available. Even though we will never fully know God, we grow so much when we realize that and then turn ourselves into lifelong seekers and learners.

So, never be satisfied with what you believe to know about God. Do not avoid conversation or the spaces that might challenge you. Because as soon as you quit learning to love God with all of your mind (Matthew 22:37), there is a real danger of using that same mind to instead justify the ways in which you are failing to love your neighbors or to even begin debating who your neighbors are.




CJ and the confirmands are wrapping up their year-long studies as they prepare for Confirmation Sunday, May 12th.



Stevie Baxter


