#### ><>FROM PASTOR KARL<><

Dear Ones,

I want to thank you for a great 2024 at First Presbyterian Church! The list is long as I think back on what we have done together in our unity in Christ. First and foremost, we have lifted our voices together in meaningful worship. In a time where we are intentionally divided, worship is a powerful witness to our community and world that God's intention is for us to be joined together in the love of Jesus Christ.

Our worship was also full of the terrific music our church has come to be known for. The bells rang, the choir sang, and various instrumentalists and soloists shared their gifts. I think my favorite moment was anytime we sang, "Holy! Holy!" I remember, in particular, closing our Easter services with it and holding my hymnal to my chest while closing my eyes and listening to all of you carry that melody while a few of you soared above it all with the descant. It was a "thin moment" for me when the veil between heaven and earth was blurred if not completely removed and God's nearness to us and power and victory over death was as apparent as ever.

In our service and mission, we grew in our presence beyond Sheridan. We took a trip to Frontera de Cristo to learn about migration, borders, and the work of the gospel as it is understood and undertaken in the border towns Douglas, Arizona and Agua Prieta, Sonora. Our senior high youth group took a trip of their own to Benton Harbor, Michigan to serve the people of that city. Finally, we are already planning to take another mission group to Omaha over spring break (March 15 - 22) to join efforts rebuilding homes that were lost in tornadoes in 2023.

We also grew our witness and mission within Sheridan. We served faithfully at Lunch Together and the Food Group. We supported the thrift store in Lame Deer with our Angel Tree offerings. We moved hundreds if not thousands of pounds of food through our Little Free Pantry to those in need, and we did our best to help all who came in with need of support concerning utility, medical, phone, and other bills. We also supported a number of local nonprofits in their work including Habitat for Humanity, Volunteers of America, the Hub, and CASA (to name a few).

These are just some of the ways we had a great year! Thank you all once again for the offerings of your hearts, hands, time, and talents that make this gospel work possible.

Moving into 2025, we have a chance to both do it all again and continue to further grow our hearts and minds in Jesus Christ. But I also want to remind you that in the church, we recognize that the turning of the calendar is not the only new beginning we have. EVERY day is a new beginning in Jesus Christ. This is the power of grace: to recreate, to renew, and to make possible all things. Let's find ourselves grounded in that grace as a congregation together and as disciples of the Savior today, this year ahead, and forever.







Filling the

U.S. Space Forces Japan was activated at Yokota Air Base on December 4, 2024, with the goal of space superiority in the region. USSFJ will serve as a focal point for deepening collaboration between the U.S. and Japan in the area of national security. This new command focuses on communications, space resilience, navigation, and missile defense. Col. Ryan Laughton is the first commanding officer of USSFJ.

Ryan is a Wyoming native, a 1994 Sheridan High School graduate and Aerospace Engineering graduate of Wichita State University, Kansas. After graduation Ryan taught English with the JET program in Akabori, Gunma prefecture, Japan, before joining the U.S. Air Force and subsequently U.S. Space Force. He has experience in space launch, operations and acquisitions and worked as an engineer, instructor, executive officer, flight commander, satellite manager, operations analyst, branch chief and materiel leader.

His parents, Gary and Sherry Laughton, were present at the activation ceremony. Ryan's spouse is Amber Laughton. Their sons are Taye and Westley who reside in Ohio.




