

Even if you are just curious to learn more about communion, this will be an insightful gathering and you are welcome to attend.

Dear Ones,

It is spring, but more importantly for us, our journey is nearing the cross and the empty tomb. Holy Week is just a couple of weeks away. As people seeking to follow Jesus, we do so by embodying his teachings and way of living. We share in his love and we share in his passion. Holy Week is a gift from God for those of us who week to follow Jesus as it shows us exactly what the embodiment of the way of Christ is. It points us toward incredibly relevant questions and puts us on the path of discipleship.

When Jesus rides into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and the crowds cheer and rejoice, we are invited to compare this to the jeering on the day of the crucifixion and wonder of ourselves the ways we misunderstand who Jesus is.

In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus implores the disciples to stay awake and join him in prayer. They fall asleep anyway. Then, they run from their arrested leader in his moment of need. This invites us to wonder how we deny, betray, and fall asleep even though Jesus has called us to action.

At the table of the Last Supper, we are asked to remember God's invitation to grace always offered.

As Jesus hangs upon the cross and then when Joseph of Arimathea removes his body and cares for it, we are invited to wonder what we are called to die to and how God will help us rise. Finally, when the women show up and the tomb is empty, we are to wonder where we see God in the world on the loose. We are to take stock of the times we have tried to contain God. And we are to know that God's love and all of the possibilities it moves us into will never be put down.

In our Lenten study book, Amy-Jill Levine writes, "[Holy Week] is meant to move us emotionally, in terms of conscience, to indict and to challenge. And it is meant to move us ethically, from faith into action." Few things move us in our faith like these seven days, tugging at our hearts and putting a tingling into our hands only satisfied when we reach out to others with the same sort of love we are reading about and experiencing. It works on us again and again, year after year after year, and is, perhaps, the most important grounding for us as Jesus' followers. I sure hope to see you repeatedly during Holy Week, soaking up what is the best story given!

On a separate note, you'll notice elsewhere in the newsletter an announcement from John and Tracey about moving to one service beginning May 25. I believe this will be good for us, and I support the Session's decision to make this move. Our sanctuary has the size to handle one service. More importantly, there is a powerful witness for us to show in putting ourselves together in this way when our society is coming apart at the seams and division is rampant. The transition will not be easy for all. But as with Holy Week, when we accept the risks of what God is doing in and among us, we stand to be filled with grace and to meet Jesus in wondrous ways.




PW Winner!

Camp Story Highlights

Hello! Here is a little camp update. It is hard to believe I have been in my position for a month already! I have hit the ground running!

I wanted to remind you that camp registration is open. The registration link can be found on campstory.org's main page; just click on the "Register for Summer Camp" button to go to the website. Remember to register by April 15 to take advantage of the Early Bird Discount and save \$25.

Camp Story will have SEVEN different sessions this summer! We have added two new sessions. One is a returning session, LIT - Leaders in Training. This camp is for those students who have finished their first year of high school and are interested in what it is like to be a counselor at camp. This camp builds a foundation for campers to grow in their faith while tending to younger campers. Part of this opportunity will be helping with You and Me Weekend and the option to continue to help during Day Camps.

Speaking of Day Camps, that is the other addition! I am excited that we will be offering two separate Day Camp sessions this year! Each has its own theme. Both day camps will be Monday through Friday, and Bomb Mountain Bus LLC will provide transportation to and from camp at no additional charge. Drop off and pick up will be at the church. If you want to use bussing, please click the transportation needed when registering. Hands, Heart, and Soul is returning this year! This camp is geared toward the camper who doesn't fit into the age parameters of our other camps. While programming is directed to the older camper, there will be activities for all ages. While sleeping in cabins is part of the Camp Story charm, we understand that bunk sleeping is not for everyone. We do not require you to stay overnight at camp. You can sign up for an RV spot or drive back and forth daily.

Mark your calendar for TLC Weekend, or you may remember it as Work Weekend. TLC Weekend will be on Friday, May 16, and Saturday, May 17. We will spend our time together sprucing up camp for the summer. We will have a variety of projects for any ability level. While RSVPs are appreciated but not necessary, those can be done on the website. A question I have received lately is, how can I help? There are so many different ways you can help. You can help by volunteering for TLC Weekend, other times by appointment, signing up for camp,

or sponsoring a camper - it could be your child, grandchild, neighbor, niece/nephew, or donating to our scholarship fund, sharing about Camp Story with your friends/family, social groups, or random strangers. Another way you can help is by purchasing something off our wish list. We always have items we would like to purchase to make life a little more luxurious, but they are unnecessary. Camp Story can always use prayers.


