#### ><>FROM PASTOR KARL<><

Dear Ones,

Each year I gather with a group of pastors to study, laugh, and rest together. I am up early this morning. No one else in the house is awake. I am sipping on my coffee and looking down from high on a mountain outside Frisco, Colorado at a couple of inches of fresh snow blanketing the ground.

Mountains hold a mysterious power. I know many of you are well aware of this. They literally lift us up, but they also raise our spirits and give us new perspectives on all that is around us and that which is within us. They make us pause because they demand that we slow down in order to truly take in all of the beauty that they hold. It is no wonder that mountains are the sites of so many events in our Holy Scriptures. Moses receives the Law upon a mountain. Jesus offers the Sermon on the Mount upon one. The psalmist wonders when looking at the hills, "Where does my help come from?" and then boldly declares, "My help comes from the LORD." Mountains are symbols of God's power and majesty. They are holy.

Yet, while sitting on this mountain, I am dearly missing cozying up with Harper Jo in the big blue chair in her room and reading a Magic Treehouse book together. That chair has become just as holy as a mountain in my life. A Wendell Berry line comes to mind at that reflection. He notes, "There are no unsacred places; there are only sacred places and desecrated places."

Beloved, the holy is everywhere around you. As God created the world and the undiscovered cosmos well beyond us, God has created in a way that is good and holy. God has touched everything and everything that God touches is sacred, be that the mountain or the big blue chair; the stream to cast your fly upon or the place to gather and catch up with friends; the family room or the hospital room; those places which we embrace easily and even those which are a bit more difficult. The holy is all around us.

Now, we could take a good amount of time to parse out the second part of the quote. We tend to miss the holy much of the time and in doing so we sometimes go so far as to desecrate it. But I'm not going to parse that out any further. As I sit on this mountain and watch the snow, it is enough for today to embrace what is front of me. I will miss reading and drawing and singing with my family today, but I can still love that the trees are white, the mountains are nourished, and the fact that I am sustained in a particular way in this place. That is holy and I am going to walk in the holy this day.

Kari McMeans, director of the Food Group, was the guest speaker for the March PW Luncheon gathering.

Kari shared that the Food Group services approximately 45% of the children in Sheridan County. This involves delivering weekly weekend food bags to each elementary school. Food pantries are also found at the junior high, high school and throughout our community including here at First Presbyterian. Food Group is privately funded and depends on the generosity of donors in our community.

Free Wheelchair Mission: The April 2 PW Luncheon program was presented by Rhea Cooksey-Dixon on Free Wheelchair Mission Project which began with one man's recognition that mobility in many underdeveloped countries was crucial to provide quality life. Those first wheelchairs were made using bicycle tires that allowed movement on rough terrain. Worldwide, it is estimated that 80 million people are in need of wheelchairs.




#### **Lucy Brock**
